Dear First family,

By the time you get this we will have finished our four-week series on our mission and vision. As a reminder, our mission is to help people:

- -Belong by feeling welcome, valued and connected to our church community.
- -Believe by developing a relationship with Jesus by grace through faith.
- -Become passionate followers of Jesus who live out their faith in every aspect of life.

Our vision is to be a gospel-community where people are valued and become passionate followers of Jesus.

To achieve this in the coming year, there are a few things I believe we need to do:

- 1. Increase our evangelistic efforts. Wayne Cordeiro, author of The Irresistible Church, says that *everything* we do as a church should have as its goal a lost soul.
- 2. Make it your goal to pray John 17:20-23 every day of the year from this point forward. This is one of Jesus' last prayers and it is one of unity for all believers. Complete unity. Too many believers pray "my kingdom come, **my** will be done." It is difficult to have disunity if we are all focused on the same thing. Like reaching those who do not yet belong to Jesus.
- 3. After being in church for a while, we begin to see the church as a social club where we get to come hang out with friends when we should see it as a place of sending sending believers out into the community with the message of Jesus. We should desire a place that is comfortable and welcoming for those who are to come and don't yet belong rather than our own personal retreat. We sing "Onward Christian Soldier!" not "Come and Sit!"
- 4. We also need to pray that God would open hearts to new methods. God's Word never changes but there has always been change in church. Church buildings change. Music changes. Did you know that the organ was invented around 246 BC, some 200 years before Jesus came on the scene? Early churches didn't have them so they must not have been necessary to grow the Kingdom. After having them in church, organs were removed from European churches following the Reformation in the 16th century. They believed the human voice itself was enough to worship God. So, you see, there has always been change in church. Someday, we will call the worship that is done in second service outdated and irrelevant. Times change and always will until Jesus comes back and establishes His kingdom once and for all. Now that will be a BIG change!

At our Deacon Retreat in January, I told the leaders that making "nice" decisions can lead to bad decisions. Tough decisions always offend someone but that doesn't mean they don't need to be made. Hang out in any pastor's office for awhile and you will see that it is impossible to please everyone. That is why I seek to please one and one only...Jesus Christ. My prayer is that we would be unified in His mission of reaching out to those who don't know Him yet no matter the personal cost to us. Let's be a church that pleases Him.



Why I Keep Coming Back

An article about the National Youth Workers Convention by Pastor Dick Smith

It's 5am in the morning, my wife and I headed once again to the youth workers oasis of another NYWC in Memphis. As we arrived at the hotel and prepared to go to the first session, I felt the sense that I have been drawn here by God's invitation. There is so much still to learn and experience in the short four days of the convention.

Those who choose to answer the call into ministry have a common bond. Most people in our church have lives that are like a stool with three legs. They have their spiritual life, their professional life, and their family life. If one of these legs wobbles, they have two others they can lean on. For pastors, those three things can merge into one leg. When you sit on a one-legged stool, it takes a lot more concentration and energy. It's a lot more exhausting. For those in ministry, we teter as we attempt to maintain a balance. It is a very difficult thing to navigate, and many fall, which in turn has a crippling effect on our faith, family and our ministries. It is so good to come to a conference with people who have this "three-legged life" in common. We find hope in the community of youth workers.

We come seeking answers, inspiration, and practical tips in ministry. Immediately, the first speaker, talked about loving people. It sounds so simple, but it's not. We were talking about love for those you don't understand, those that scare you. My mind wandered to my church family back home. I thought of my own struggles to love as I know I should and of others in my church who are struggling with the same issue, and the lack of unity we have experienced as a result. My soul longs for us to love. My heart began to pray: "Lord help me love and lead others to do the same. We need a second touch. Underneath we've become hard, Lord, break up the hard plow pan in our spiritual soil, as a farmer does to his field in order to grow a healthy crop, and help us become spiritually healthy again."

The seminars at the conference offer an amazing wide range of resources to equip us in this ever-changing youth ministry we are a part of. Two seminars really helped me. In our student ministry back home we have seen a huge jump in our middle school ministry. It feels like we are herding cats sometimes. But I keep remember something that was said at the conference that I needed to be reminded of, "Do you see them as a problem to be solved or a wonder to behold?" There is a drive within us all that desires to have what we do matter and have purpose. Behind that drive there is lasting inspiration to remember the wonder of it all.

I headed to a seminar titled, "Understanding Teenage Brains." Knowing what is going on in their brains when they enter puberty could probably change the world. We know about the physical aspect of puberty but it's the cognitive that is ultimately going to shape their lives moving forward. They are shifting from concrete to abstract thinking as they experience a huge spike of neurons in their brains during this time. For the next few years they will need our help in wrestling with their doubts and how to process that while helping to normalize what they are experiencing.

What really excited me was learning about the anterior cingulate, the section of your brain that is right behind your frontal lobe. Part of its function is to help us understand God as compassionate and loving. Studies have shown that prayer, meditation and faith based singing grow the anterior cingulate. When we sing we tap into the anterior cingulate! I am a worship leader as well so I go home understanding the worship I lead matters in ways I never knew.

The second seminar that stood out for me was, "What Research is Telling Us About Flourishing in Ministry." I went to this one because I have worked with people in ministry who have burned out and I have also come close to the edge of it myself. The seminar sought to help us become aware of the signs of burnout and how to measure our spiritual well-being. One particular measure is the lines between positive and negative sacrifice. We suffer when we don't ever take the hero cape off when we fail to know the difference in these types of sacrifice. When we learn to manage these correctly we stay vibrantly attached to the Vine and it could be the difference between staying or leaving the ministry because of burnout.

God is faithful. Each year the dream which first inspired us to begin in youth ministry is revived. We may have entered the weekend with a dwindling flame, but after we gather together at NYWC with thousands of youth workers from across the country, the fire in us is reignited. This year, as I head home, I am reminded once again of that dream. I am not alone, God is with me, he is with us.
