Conversion and Discipleship

"If anyone would come after Me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow Me." (v.34)

"For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for Me and the gospel will save it." (v. 35)

- Salvation by grace through faith
- "Believing means considerably more than affirming certain statements to be true."
- "Believing into" = trusting and identifying with (John's Gospel)
- "Faith without works is dead" = is not real faith (James 2:17,26)
- "The obedience of faith" (Rom. 1:5; 16:26)
- "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." (Eph. 2:10)
- "The gospel is opposed to earning but not to effort." (Dallas Willard)
- We live as disciples in obedience not to get in but because we are already in.
